1.	Half-term update	
	Mrs Götschel advised that she was very impressed and the students should	
	be congratulated on how they have coped with remote learning, being in	
	isolation as well as missing their friends.	
	The KS3 engagement in lessons is generally good. Year 11 students have	
	had excellent attendance and been outstanding role models; year 10	
	students and post-16 students have also shown good engagement.	
2.	COVID cases update	
	There have been 7 positive cases of COVID amongst students and 6 positive	
	cases amongst staff where two members of staff were admitted to hospital	
	and one member of staff remains very ill in critical care.	

	It has been particularly difficult during lockdown for staff with young children as there have been COVID cases in primary and early years settings.	
	Lateral Flow Testing	
	There is a team of staff who have received training and are involved in the testing of students and staff who are currently in school on a weekly basis. The lateral flow tests are performed by the students and staff themselves by taking a nasal swab; the administration process in relation to the registration and uploading of test results is quite an unwieldy process.	
	The DfE previously suggested that testing of staff and students should be undertaken every day so that whole year groups of students would not need to be sent home to isolate if someone in their group received a positive COVID test. Public Health Birmingham had recommended that the daily checks should not be carried out as the lateral flow test results are not completely reliable; the DfE have also now paused contact testing. Once all students return to school, testing will become a much larger operation and the process for doing this is currently being reviewed.	
3.	Virtual Parents' Evenings A year 9 parents' evening has taken place and we will review parent feedback. The software being used is School Cloud and this was used for parents' evenings last term and worked very well with good feedback received from parents. The 11 parents' evening had to be rearranged as the provider's server crashed on the first occasion. Unfortunately, the provider also had issues on the second occasion with the result that phone calls had to be made. Mrs Götschel thanked the parents who wrote to their MPs regarding additional funding for schools to cover the costs making schools COVID safe.	
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4.	School Re-opening The DfE has advised that they will give the school two weeks' notice regarding the date of re-opening. The government has advised that this may be on 8 <sup>th</sup> March 2021 but this has not been confirmed and no information has been provided regarding whether this will be a whole school return, tiered return, exam groups or staggered start return. As soon as further information is received, Mrs Götschel will update parents.	
5.	The following questions submitted from parents were discussed:-	
	How will GCSEs be graded in the Summer? Mrs Götschel advised that the Ofqual consultation ended on 29 <sup>th</sup> January 2021.	

Ofqual is proposing that teachers should produce a grade based on the level that the students are working at. The proposal is that the grade should be based on formal tests, mock examination results and substantial candidate work.         The exam board may produce tests for the students which would give a level of objectivity as everyone would then be assessed on the same basis.         This year Ofqual are focussing on ensuring that year 11 and year 13 students have the knowledge and skill to progress onto the next stage in their education be it post-16 or university.         Mrs Gotschel proposed that once Ofqual confirm their decision following the consultation, a series of parents' forums for year 11 and year 13 students could be arranged for e.g. a maximum number of attendees (25) each session. This would provide parents with an opportunity to ask any questions that they may have.         Why do students need to use a camera for the whole duration of lessons?         The guidance is for students to keep the camera on for at least part of the lesson for safeguarding purposes. This is to protect both students and staff as we can then see who is actually present in the room during the lesson can cause broadband overload and have been given guidance that students must put on their camera during registration and also at certain points in the lesson e.g. when answering a question.
