#### Welcome back

Wow! What a first week back. I don't think any of us were expecting the Ofsted 'call' on Monday morning.

I would just like to thank all the parents and students who completed the parent/student survey. I know the inspectors really appreciated your feedback.

I would also like to thank the students for their fantastic behaviour and manners over the two days. For those who work in the school it felt very 'normal' to see the students walking around the school with purpose, playing nicely together at break/lunch time, lining up in an orderly fashion - for the inspectors it was a real treat to see such lovely behaviour and as a result they very purposely asked me to pass on their thanks.

We are not able to share the outcomes of the inspection until it is published on the Ofsted website. When this happens I will write to you to let you know that it is available to read.

## **COVID Changes**

There was an update to the COVID guidance during the half term break. These changes include:

- The end of twice weekly testing for all staff and students.
- There will no longer be the need to undertake LFD for 7 days after being in close contact with a confirmed case.
- The legal requirement to self-isolate for 10 days after testing positive will be replaced with the 'guidance' to self isolate for 6 days or more days if suffering COVID symptoms. Just because it is no longer a 'legal' requirement we still expect students to stay at home if they have COVID symptoms OR test positive for COVID.
   COVID measures are now in line with other contagious infections like Chicken pox, although there is no 'legal' requirement to isolate, we all do so to protect the others in the school
- If suffering with COVID, students should undertake 2 LFD test on day 5 and 6 after symptoms start, if both tests are negative and they no longer have a temperature, they will be able to return to school. If they are still positive, they should remain at home until day 10 OR 2 negative tests are received (whichever is sooner)

If you think your child has COVID it is still essential that you contact the school to report the reason for absence. Even if you do not have a test result to confirm your suspicions, it is important that you mention that you think they have COVID symptoms when reporting the absence. This is because we have to report all COVID related absences in a different way to 'normal' illness.

Moving forward we will now only be provided with a small stock of LFD tests. These will be to supply students/staff with enough tests to undertake tests on day 5/6 if they are unwell with COVID symptoms. We encourage all students to keep a small supply at home if they are required. If you require additional tests please contact the school office, who will arrange for some to be delivered to your child.

## **Tariff increase**

# Holocaust Educational Trust Book Club Recommendations Ordinary Men - Christopher Browning

Ordinary Men is the true story of Reserve Police Battalion 101 of the German Order Police, which was responsible for mass shootings as well as round-ups of Jewish people for deportation to Nazi death camps in Poland in 1942. Browning argues that most of the men of RPB 101 were not fanatical Nazis but, rather, ordinary middle-aged, working-class men who committed these atrocities out of a mixture of motives, including the group dynamics of conformity, deference to authority, role adaptation, and the altering of moral norms to justify their actions. Very quickly three groups emerged within the battalion: a core of eager killers, a plurality who carried out their duties reliably but without initiative, and a small minority who evaded participation in the acts of killing without diminishing the murderous efficiency of the battalion whatsoever.

#### Travelers in the Third Reich – Julia Boyd

This is an extraordinary history of the rise of the Nazis based on fascinating first hand accounts, drawing together a multitude of voices and stories, including students, politicians, musicians, diplomats, schoolchildren, communists, scholars, athletes, poets, journalists, fascists, artists, tourists, even celebrities like Charles Lindbergh and Samuel Beckett. Their experiences create a remarkable three dimensional picture of Germany under Hitler.
