Roofing

In November Lordswood Academies Trust applied for some government funding to replace the roofing in the school. A few weeks ago we were delighted to discover that we had been successful in securing this funding.

Last week we met with the company who will be overseeing the project and we would like to share a few of the details with you as it is a 20 week project and therefore will inevitably have an impact on the day to day running of the school.

We are hoping that the section of the project that will cause the most disruption will be completed over the summer holidays - this is the replacement of the roof on the 'main building'. In order to get this completed during the summer, the company will need to start erecting the scaffolding starting on Monday morning (27th June)

The largest inconvenience will be the scaffolding that will be erected down the side of the school closest to the netball courts. Once this scaffolding is in place, students will no longer be able to enter the building via the antehall doors. All students will be informed when this will happen. Once in place students will access the building via the North doors OR via the

netball courts and into the building via the doors in the hall. The contractors will ensure that lockers are still accessible for as long as possible, however there is a chance that we will have to take the lockers out of action for the last week of term. Whilst we understand that this is not ideal, the long term benefits will definitely outweigh the short term inconvenience.

Please can you discuss with students the need to be sensible during the work and remind them of the need to follow instructions at all times - this is to keep them and others safe.
